What can you count as elective courses?	General Guidelines
 What counts: Regularly scheduled 500-level CMN courses taught by MA program faculty What counts as a restricted elective: STC 505, STC 520, STC 525, STC 535, STC 540, STC 545, STC 547 Approved courses by faculty advisor and program director What needs to be approved (in advance) by both your advisor & the graduate program director: Individualized CMN courses (e.g., 580, 584, 590, 592) 500-level courses taught by non-program faculty (e.g., courses in other colleges) 400-level courses in any discipline Courses transferred in from other universities 	 You may apply only 3 credits of 400-level work toward the master's degree, with faculty approval You may only apply 6 credits from 500-level non-CMN courses toward your degree (including transfer credits) You must meet all GPA and grade requirements outlined in the New College Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy You must be enrolled in at least one credit that appears on your iPOS or or one credit of CMN 595 continuing registration each Fall/Spring semester. All coursework must be approved by your faculty advisor and formalized in the iPOS. Mere enrollment in a course does not entitle you to count it toward a graduate degree.
