

INNOVATIONS IN PSYCHOLOGICAL RESEARCH GRANT

GENERAL POLICY & GUIDELINES

General Overview

As a way to enhance the research and grant writing experience for ground MS Psychology students, the MS Psychology program will offer four grants of up to \$1,250 (two in Fall semester and two in Spring semester) for innovative student research (hereafter referred to as the IPR grant). These grants will allow students to conduct research that they might normally not be able to carry out with their traditional research funding through the MS Psychology program.

Fall deadline: October 15th

Spring deadline: February 1st

Application Process

Students will be asked to submit the attached application proposal addressing the background/significance, specific aims, and proposed methods of their research (no more than 2 pages in length). Special attention will be given to the innovative aspect of the research. Students will also submit a CV, timeline, proposed budget, and copy of IRB approval (if applicable).

Award Process

If more than 2 applications are received by the deadlines, then an ad hoc committee of 3 Psychology faculty will review the applications and make award decisions based on the following criteria: 1) quality and innovation of the research proposed; 2) feasibility of conducting the research within the timeline; and 3) financial need over and above what the students can receive through the traditional MS Psych, Grad College, and GPSA funding sources. The ad hoc committee will make their decisions no later than 2 weeks following the submission deadline.

Source of Funding

The IPR grant monies will be funded through the MS Psychology program fees account.
