General Guidelines			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Generally, courses should be 500-level or above. Two related 400-level courses may be approved.</li> <li>- Any course that is not listed on this advising check sheet must be approved prior to counting it on your iPOS.</li> <li>- <b>*Indicates a forensic psychology course. Course access for MS psychology students may be limited based on capacity.</b></li> <li>- We recommend that you take core courses when they are offered.</li> <li>- Not all elective courses will be offered every semester.</li> <li>- The Interactive Program of Study (iPOS) must be filed when you have registered for or completed 50% of your coursework.</li> <li>- You must maintain a 3.0 GPA in your iPOS Coursework, Graduate Coursework GPA, and Cumulative Graduate GPA.</li> <li>- PSY 553 must be taken in your last semester of study. You must receive a "B" (3.0) in the course to graduate. A "B-" or lower will not count.</li> <li>- All coursework must be completed within 6 years of the first course that appears on your iPOS.</li> <li>- Any course not listed on this advising check sheet must be approved by the Program Director to count toward the program.</li> <li>- Courses completed at another institution may not be included in the Online Psychology program.</li> <li>- Preadmission requests will be reviewed on a case by case basis and limited to no more than 6 credit hours.</li> <li>- Students are limited to a maximum of six credit hours of electives <i>outside</i> of the program electives offered.</li> </ul>
