- Generally, courses should be 500-level or above. Two related 400-level courses may be approved.

- Any course that is not listed on this advising check sheet must be approved prior to counting it on your iPOS.
- We recommend that you take core courses when they are offered.
- Not all elective courses will be offered every semester.
- The Interactive Program of Study (iPOS) must be filed when you have registered for or completed 50% of your coursework.
- You must maintain a 3.0 GPA in your iPOS Coursework, Graduate Coursework GPA, and Cumulative Graduate GPA.
- PSY 590 must be taken in your last semester of study. You must receive a "B" (3.0) in the course to graduate. A "B-" or lower will not count.
- All coursework must be completed within 6 years of the first course that appears on your iPOS.
- Any course not listed on this advising check sheet must be approved by the Program Director to count toward the program.
- Courses completed at another institution may not be included in the Online Psychology program.
