<p><b>What counts:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Regularly scheduled 500-level JHR courses taught by MA program faculty</li> </ul> <p><b>What needs to be approved (in advance) by both the student's faculty advisor &amp; the graduate program director:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*Individualized JHR courses (e.g., 580, 584, 590, 592)</li> <li>500-level courses taught by non-program faculty (e.g., courses in other colleges)</li> <li>400-level courses in any discipline</li> <li>Courses transferred in from other universities</li> </ul> <p><b>What does not count:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>593, 595, or 599 credits</li> <li>100, 200, or 300-level courses</li> </ul>	<p><b>Faculty approval required for:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>up to 6 credit hours of 400-level work may apply toward the master's degree.</li> <li>All coursework in the iPOS. Mere enrollment in a course does not entitle a student to count it toward a graduate degree.</li> </ul> <p><b>Academic progress:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students are required to meet <a href="#">New College Satisfactory Academic Progress Standards</a> and maintain continuous enrollment as defined by the <a href="#">ASU Graduate College Policy Manual</a>.</li> <li>The culminating experience is completed in a student's final year of study. To be eligible for registration consult the program handbook.</li> <li>For information regarding the minimum passing grade for the JHR 549, 593 or 599 culminating experience, please go to <a href="#">New College Satisfactory Academic Progress Standards</a>.</li> </ul> <p><b>Policies:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Core courses can never be transferred from other universities.</li> <li>All work toward a master's degree must be completed within six consecutive years.
